

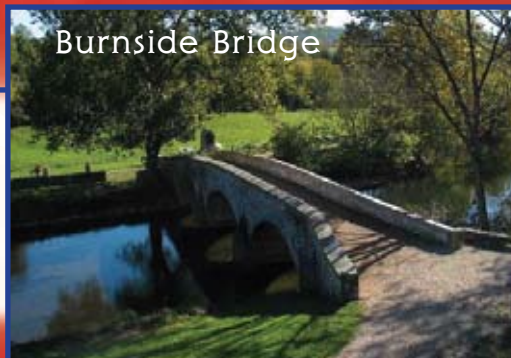

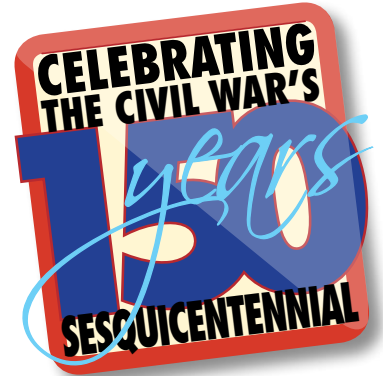

TUITION

Tuition for programs is \$1,400 per person; \$700 is due upon acceptance with the balance due at registration. The tuition covers accommodations, admissions, tour transportation, instruction, and one graduate credit hour. Meals are not included. Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from the program as well as transfer from the airport to the hotel upon arrival.
